Dr. Sanford's professional career has spanned the elementary through college and graduate school levels. She has been a classroom teacher, teacher of guidance, assistant principal, and principal in the New York City school system. She taught education courses at Baruch College and at Fordham University. She was a visiting practitioner and teaching fellow at the Principals' Center at Harvard University, Graduate School of Education. Honorary doctorates were conferred on the former Regent of the Board of Regents of the State University of New York (in March 2001, she was elected Vice Chancellor of the Board of Regents) by Mercy College, The Bank Street College of Education, Five Towns College, and most recently, St. John's University. She is a graduate of Brooklyn College, Wellesley College, and Fordham University, where she was a Ford Foundation Fellow in Urban Education. On the occasion of the 125th Anniversary of Wellesley College in Massachusetts, the African Studies Department presented The First Distinguished Black Alumna Award to Adelaide Sanford in recognition of her lifetime accomplishments.
